With the signing of HB 326 into law, pharmacists and pharmacy interns are now able to fit diabetic shoes. The Ohio State Board of Pharmacy encourages pharmacists and pharmacy interns to obtain appropriate training that covers the fitting and patient management of therapeutic diabetic shoes and inserts. During this session, attendees will get hands on experience fitting diabetic shoes and will learn how to appropriately bill for their services.

How to Fit Diabetic Shoes

Dr. Gary Ritz, PDM, R.Ph., University Primary Care Practices Dr. Gary Ritz, podiatrist and pharmacist, has practiced for 25 years and is an expert in diabetic shoes. During this interactive session, he will explain the basics of fitting diabetic shoes. He will also review the anatomy of the foot and special areas of interest for diabetic feet. Additionally, there will be a hands-on demonstration of fitting shoes, making molds of feet, and demonstrating proper technique for inserting insoles. Participants will then have the opportunity to make impressions of their own feet and make insoles for a pair of diabetic tennis shoes.

Billing for Diabetic Shoe Fitting

Participants will also learn the steps to bill for a diabetic shoe fitting. Dr. Ritz will review how to appropriately bill for diabetic shoe fitting and how this can become a profitable patient care service in your pharmacy.
