Heart disease continues to be the leading cause of death in the United States, with nearly 1 of every 6 healthcare dollars (about \$200 billion) devoted to healthcare services, medications, and lost productivity. Common conditions such as hypertension, atherosclerosis, and diabetes are key heart disease risk factors, and public health efforts like the Million Hearts® Collaboration to Prevent Heart Disease and Stroke (MHC) prioritize educa-

tion and implementation of evidence-based cardiovascular (CV) prevention strategies. The 2019 American College of Cardiology/ American Heart Association Guideline on the Primary Prevention of Cardiovascular Disease (as well as recent literature) introduces updated recommendations on lifestyle/medications to support ideal CV health. This session will review patient-centered approaches to comprehensive disease prevention, with a special update on CV disease in patients with diabetes. DAPA-HF, DIABETES, AND HEART FAILURE, OH MY!

Approximately 26 million patients worldwide have a diagnosis of heart failure (HF) and hospitalizations associated with this disease are all too common. Recent trials have shown a decrease in hospitalizations associated with HF in patients with diabetes mellitus (DM) when utilizing sodium-glucose cotransporter (SGLT2) inhibitors. The Dapagliflozin and Pre-

vention of Adverse Outcomes in Heart Failure (DAPA-HF) trial explores the potential of utilizing dapagliflozin for the treatment of patients with a diagnosis of HF, with or without DM. Reviewing this trial and other recent trials involving SGLT2 inhibitors will further allow the opportunity to touch on the pathophysiology of DM and HF, as well as their guideline directed medical treatments.
