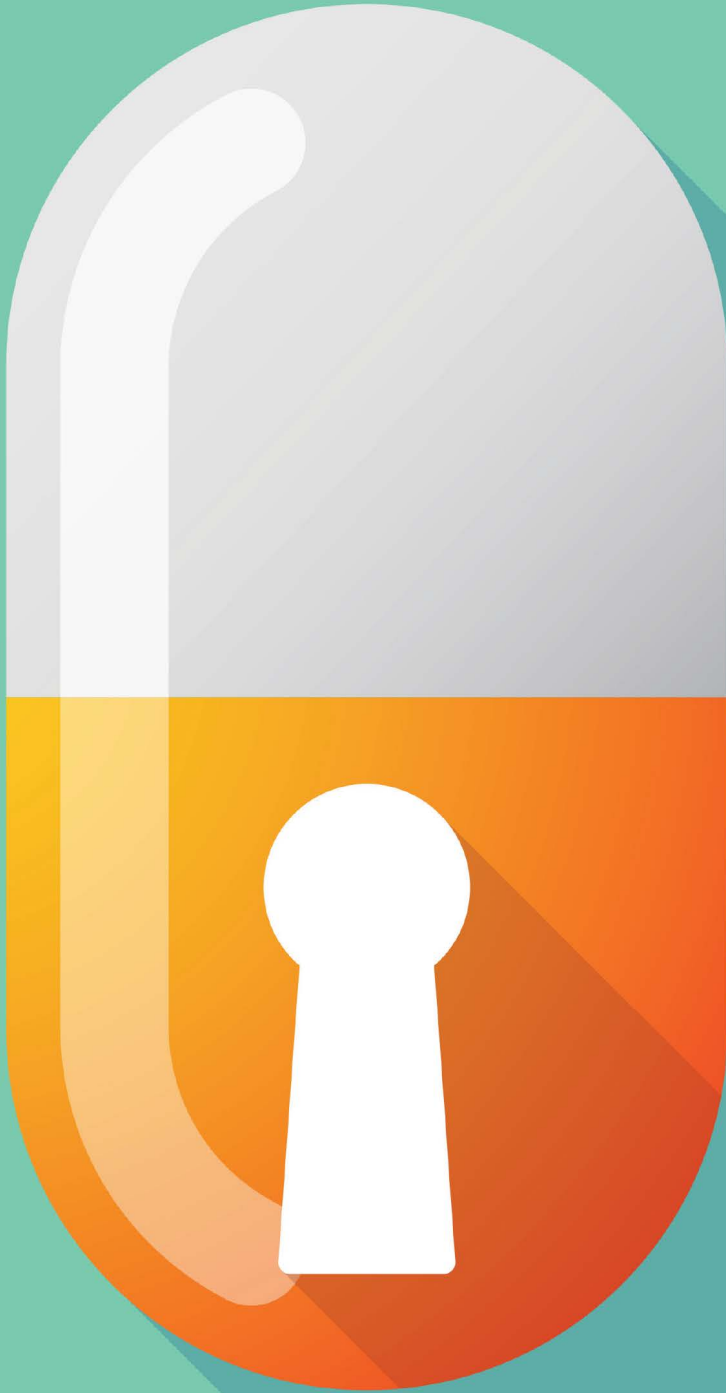

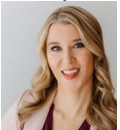

Section 340B of the Public Health Service Act requires drug manufacturers to provide discounted pricing on covered outpatient drugs to eligible covered entities. These savings play a critical role in supporting operational efficiency and improving access to care. As the health care landscape evolves and market dynamics shift, the 340B Program continues to face new complexities. This session will begin with an overview of current trends from the 340B Prime Vendor Program (PVP). Attendees will gain practical strategies to navigate these challenges and strengthen their organization's compliance and integrity within the 340B Program.

340B Litigative Update

Notable developments include federal and state courts denying manufacturer requests to block state 340B laws, reaffirming states' authority to enforce pharmacy protections. Additionally, more recent litigation involving major health systems exposes ongoing disputes over potential 340B fund diversion. This evolving legal environment underscores the importance for stakeholders to stay informed and adapt their strategies accordingly, ensuring compliance amid these significant legal and regulatory developments.

When You Can't Hire, Automate explores how organizations can maintain service quality and operational efficiency despite ongoing staffing shortages. This session focuses on the practical implementation of AI-powered IVR systems to reduce workload on limited technical staff, streamline customer interactions, and improve response times. Attendees will learn how automation can be strategically deployed to handle routine

tasks, triage service needs, and support overextended teams—turning workforce constraints into an opportunity for innovation and scalability. Real-world insights and actionable steps will help participants identify where AI powered IVR can deliver immediate impact within their own operations.

- identify key operational challenges caused by technician shortages and recognize opportunities where AI IVR can improve efficiency and service delivery;

Managing Manufacturer 340B Policies and What Comes Next

Since first coming into effect in 2020, FQHCs have had to find strategies to address manufacturers' contract pharmacy restrictions. This session will focus on hands on operational strategies to address manufacturer contract pharmacy restrictions and help restore access to 340B medications. We will discuss alternatives for addressing the manufacturer restrictions, principally by designation of single pharmacies under alternate sites and data submission to 340B manufacturer-chosen vendors. The speaker will review the use of pharmacy designation and limited data sharing as methods to restore access to restricted manufacturers, as well as share real-world FQHC experiences from FQHCs already participating in these models.

At the completion of this activity, the participant will be able to:

- review recent changes in the contract pharmacy landscape and types of restrictions imposed by manufacturers;
- illustrate the steps involved to restore 340B access through data sharing and designating contract pharmacies to health center associated sites; and
- compare and contrast strategies used by FQHCs to mitigate the impact to medication access and FQHC operational margin.
